How have you grown spiritually at Durham?



Where did you go after DCHS and what do you do now?

Brad: I attended Redeemer University and graduated with Business Marketing Honours. I currently work for Bell Canada as a Regional Sales Manager.

Michelle: I attended Mohawk College where I graduated with an Honours Diploma in Legal Office Administration. I currently work as a law clerk for Russell Alexander Collaborative Family Lawyers and have been with this firm for six years now.

What are some fond memories you have of Durham?

Brad: My favourite part about DCHS are the life long friendships that I made. It was great building friendships with people that had the same set of beliefs and core values that helped me grow in my faith. Playing music and sports, attending dances, trips, and events were definitely a highlight for me.

Michelle: Through Praise Team, I was able to go to Nashville in 2009 and Chicago in 2011. In Grade 12, I was a member of Student Parliament which planned a number of school events. In Grade 12 the school introduced a new law course which is what inspired me to pursue my career.

How did Durham prepare you for life in the real world?

Brad: The importance of hard work was reinforced in me during my time at Durham. There were some classes that I didn't see value in, but I came to realise the importance of trying your best even if you're not necessarily interested. Durham also helped challenged me to be more like Jesus.

Michelle: Through the discipline impressed upon me at Durham I was able to successfully complete each of my courses and I ended up graduating from Mohawk with Honours. I was also the recipient of the Ross and McBride Scholarship award for academic excellence. In my career I continue to use the same principles of discipline and hard work.

Socially, I was blessed to come out of Durham with lasting friendships. To this day, my husband and I are still quite close with many of our friends from Durham. We've gone to school together, gone to each other's weddings and seen many of us become parents. It has been a blessing to gain lasting friendships with people who share the same faith and values.





As you went out into the world, what did you notice in hindsight about the uniqueness of Durham? What makes this place special?

Brad: Considering Durham was such a big part of my life, I always found it interesting that when you told people in Bowmanville that you went to Durham, very few people knew that it even existed! That being said, for me, it was one of the most important and influential places for me. My parents presented me with the choice of attending public high school in grade 11 and 12, but I had begged them to allow me to continue going to Durham. The small town feel of the school truly creates a sense of connectedness between the students, as well as the relationships with the staff.

Michelle: Durham provided me with the firm foundation I needed to go out into the world and know what I stood for as a young Christian woman. When making new friends in college, I was often met with shock when I would tell them the size of the high school I went to.

Nicole has two kids currently enrolled at Durham – Rachelle (grade 12) and Ben (grade 9). Cristina's son Luka is also in grade 9 this year.



How have you seen your children transform during their time at Durham?

Nicole: Attending Durham has helped our kids further develop their academics, their faith, and their social life. They have a lot of respect for the teachers and appreciate that the teachers have a high level of knowledge about the subjects they teach. In classes and through various school activities such as chapel, they are enjoying learning about life and faith. Our kids have made good friends and enjoy participating in various clubs and athletics. They enjoy the annual trip to Ontario Pioneer Camp and the various field trips and school outings. Our daughter is also very excited about the upcoming Europe trip.

Cristina: Although it's only been a couple of months of school, Luka is obtaining the best marks we have ever seen. His peers include him in their group - many of whom have known each other for so long but they include Luka which is heartwarming!

What are some examples of Durham stepping up to meet the needs of your children?

Cristina: Mrs. Brinkman has been so kind and it truly shows that Luka is not just another number. You wouldn't get such kind

attention and care in any other school. They're always willing to help and respond to messages in a timely manner. It is apparent that they go the extra distance for student's success. The body of Christ is so present at DCHS!

Nicole: The teachers and staff at Durham know the students personally. When our kids have been away from school due to health or family reasons, they've felt cared for and have been given extensions on assignments and tests. As parents, we are thankful for the feedback from teachers and their availability to communicate and meet with us if needed. We are grateful for the time and energy that the staff and teachers invest into all aspects of the students' lives.




